

## **TAP Summer Program FAQ's**

1. What are the dates?
  - June 27<sup>th</sup> – August 5<sup>th</sup> (6 Weeks)
  - No Camp on July 4<sup>th</sup> prices will be adjusted for the missed day
  - You can register for as many weeks as you wish from only one to all six
  - **Mandatory Parent Orientation Date June 18<sup>th</sup> at 10am at The Autism Project**
  
2. What are the times?
  - 9am-3pm Monday through Friday
  - Teen Traveling Camp will only meet Mondays, Wednesdays & Fridays (9am-4pm)
  - 7am-9am for before care & 3pm-6pm for after care
  
3. What is the cost?
  - \$520 per week for Summer Programs (Due The Monday of your Registered Week)
  - Teen Traveling Camp Price is \$315 (Due The Monday of your Registered Week)
  - Week of 4<sup>th</sup> of July Prices Adjust to \$420 for Day Programs and \$210 for Travel Camp due to Holiday
  - \$10 per hour for before and after care
  - \$100 extra if your child requires one to one services to ensure success in the summer programs

  - Camp is covered for all Medicaid Waiver students under Therapeutic Integration Services
  
4. When does registration begin?
  - Monday April 4<sup>th</sup> at 9am
  - Please register via email to [theautismproject1@gmail.com](mailto:theautismproject1@gmail.com) for your preferred week
  - Registration will be on a first come first serve basis
  - Registration is final after June 1<sup>st</sup> and any cancellations after that will be charged a \$25 fee
  - Placement for those entering into the 6<sup>th</sup> grade will be based on staffs discretion for the middle school/high school camp versus the elementary school programs
  - Camp registration forms are due by JUNE 1<sup>st</sup>, if not your spot will not be secure
  
5. Will there be a waitlist?
  - Once max registration has been met there will be a waitlist taken for each week
  - Waitlist registrants will ideally be notified a week in advance but please keep in mind that last minute notifications are possible
  
6. What will a typical day consist of?
  - The Elementary and Middle/High School Programs will be different with their day to day activities
  - All participants will be swimming frequently
  - All participants will be going on community outings
  - All participants will be exposed to a in a variety of activities; including: art, fitness and motor skills, board games, outdoor sports and games and much more.
  
7. What will the staff to child ratio be for summer programs?
  - The ratio will vary depending on those registered
  
8. What if your child takes medicine during program hours?
  - The medication can be distributed daily and a weekly amount can be stored at TAP
  - A completed medication form is required for distribution
